MARK PACOE has performed as soloist and accompanist domestically and abroad. As prize winner from the Oundle International Young Organists' Academy in Great Britain, Mark has performed recitals at St. Paul's Cathedral, Chichester Cathedral, and St. Mary's Cathedral (Edinburgh Fringe Festival). Mr. Pacoe's recent engagements include performances at St. Thomas Church (Fifth Avenue, New York), St. Paul's Cathedral (Pittsburgh), Trinity Church (Copley Square, Boston), Princeton University Chapel (New Jersey), Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels (Los Angeles), "Voices in the House International Music Festival" concerts at Sydney Opera House and Sydney Town Hall, and "Perform in Harmony with Olympic Spirit" at Forbidden City Concert Hall in Beijing, the Oriental Arts Center in Shanghai, and at Vienna's Peterskirche and Konzerthaus as featured soloist for the International Haydn Festival (2009). Upcoming engagements this year include performances at The Sydney Opera House, St. Mark's Episcopal Church (Berkely, CA), and the Montgomery (Alabama) AGO chapter recital series. Mr. Pacoe will also be serving on the faculty of the Delaware Pipe Organ Encounter (June 2011) for young organists.

Mr. Pacoe's primary teachers include Ronald Doiron, Janette Fishell and David Higgs. Mark has published several articles on sacred music in the *GIA Quarterly*, and *Word on Worship*, the Newsletter of the Office of Divine Worship of the Archdiocese of Newark in Spring 2006. Mr. Pacoe is coordinator for the American Federation Pueri Cantores Organ Scholar Program and serves as Director of Music for St. Malachy's Church - The Actors' Chapel located in the heart of New York's theater district in Times Square.
